II. PUBLIC FORUM:

Following recognition by the President (board clerk today), members of the public shall have an opportunity to address the Board of Trustees either before or during the Board's consideration of each item of business to be discussed. In order to efficiently manage the business of the Board, the Board President may limit the amount of time allocated for each individual speaker to 3 minutes and limit the total time allocated on a particular issue to 15 minutes, pursuant to board policy. Items not appearing on the agenda cannot, by law, be the subject of Board action. Such items may be placed on future agendas for full discussion and/or action.

Public Forum:

Laura Price: I'm here with a lot of hurt and worry in my heart. I'm truly concerned for the future of our schools and also our community. While I truly believe the board has had the best interest of our schools, kids and staff at heart and have rolled with all the covid punches. The Governor is asking parents to choose between a traditional education or giving children a vaccine with so many unknowns. I believe that we, as a school, can and

should fight this. We have a small school and so many few cases unlike surrounding districts. As we go through this fiasco, I hope that you consider fighting the governor on this as our district cannot afford to lose any more students. That's it, thank you.

Whitney: During the public forum is there anybody who would like to address the board?

Jan Smith: I'd like to thank Laura for making that comment and I'm curious to know of ideas, because of our small number of students, how we could work on a consensus based approach to address the state mandate. We may be able to navigate this with the state and maybe seek an exception with our concerns.

Selina Martinez: I thank Laura for stepping up and that is one of the things that concerns me as a parent, and I appreciate your courage Laura.

Jan Smith: When a parent expresses a concern like that what is our process.

Mr. Gamino: Jan, this is a public comment at this time. We listened to it and see what if anything we can do as we know obviously there is concern. We will be monitoring to see what options we may or may not have. But this is time for the public to give us their comments and not to address it at this point.

Jan Smith: Thank you for explaining the process to me.

Mr. Gamino: Superintendent's Report: I will start with a fundraiser we are doing here in Cuyama on October 23rd and I want to let everyone know Mr. Barnes is leading and Laura Price is also helping lead the event. I would like them to inform the board and give them an update on what we are doing on the 23rd and how we are going to pass out that information. It is our goal to make it a whole community event for the Michael Wilson Scholarship. I will ask Mr. Barnes to provide an update:

Mr. Barnes: We put a small community committee with Laura, Mr. Gamino, and a high school student. We had a meeting and talked about different ideas such as carnival type games, food, free throw shooting contest, raffle at the high school from 9 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. We are looking for donation items such as gift cards or donation items that we can add it in the raffle, we would appreciate that. The money that we will raise will go to a memorial for Mr. Wilson. What we do for the memorial is a future conversation and any money we don't use will go to the Wilson Family Scholarship.

Mr. Gamino: It is a really great event. I'm looking forward to it. It has been a long time coming. It was difficult for us to do anything last year due to covid. I will send a copy of the flier to all board members. Laura Price did the flier for us.

Mr. Gamino: Covid Process update: We are using Mobile Med. Every staff member certificated and classified who is not vaccinated is required to have a covid test weekly. It will be done every Tuesday from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. Vaccinated staff members can register for weekly tests as they wish (optional). Tuesday, October 19, 2021, will be our first date.

Whitney Goller: As of right now, what is our testing protocol for staff?

Mr. Gamino: Anybody that is unvaccinated must Covid test weekly. Anybody that is vaccinated may register and do the weekly test as well if they wish. For example, I will Covid test if I feel that I am not doing to well. I have already registered. It is free and it is done here.

Whitney: And at this moment we are requiring the parents that want to visit the site to be either vaccinated or have the negative covid test. So is this Mobile Med a possibility for parents?

Gamino: Let me check as I know it will be for their kids. I did send a letter to the parents with a link to register their children if they would like. Let me see if Mobile Med can register the parent as well.

Whitney Goller: Will this be a time to have a discussion about the coming vaccine for our students or can I request this item in the future?

Gamino: Under Superintendent report we can have a discussion on the vaccine mandate for students.

Whitney: Yes, having a discussion would be fine.

Attendance Report: Elementary School is 89% and high school is 88%. If our students are not feeling well, they are encouraged to stay home. Our enrollment number is 182 students K-12. I will bring those numbers every month. It seems during the winter our kids get sick.

Whitney: Maybe we can send a reminder about an independent study. That should keep our ADA up.

Gamino: Williams Report: We do get visited every year. Teachers were prepared and had every student book out. Teachers have this process down and knew exactly what they had to do. We did very well. We should get this report in the next few weeks.

Selina Martinez: How are we protecting staff (confidential) if they are being tested.

Gamino: Just because we are being tested does not mean they are not vaccinated. Nobody knows. When people go and take the test, it does not mean they are or are not vaccinated. We will have fully vaccinated staff members take the tests as well (Optional). From my perspective we are one team whether or not we are or are not vaccinated. We respect each other. This is a district team. Some people have shared it.

Selina: Those that want to get tested will go in one room. I don't understand how we are protecting anybody's privacy. If I was vaccinated, I would not go get tested.

Gamino: Well, in our district some vaccinated people are going to take the test. If four of us are going to test, I cannot make the assumption that they are or are not vaccinated. I can work with the vendor to see if they can come in one door and out the other. No signs that the board room is a Covid testing outside the door.

Jan Smith: It seems there are concerns about privacy issues. There are concerns that there may be profiling or targeting a person. I know that you cannot assume that a person who tests does not mean they are unvaccinated. There are still concerns.

Gamino: I will talk to Mobile Med to see if we can make it as private as we can. I will tell you that I have not seen a staff member putting anyone down or making a comment because they are or are not vaccinated. I feel we are working together very well.

Jan Smith: It sounds like others may have had experiences.

Gamino: We will figure something out. Selina, if you have a suggestion. I don't know that a sign in sheet would be effective. We will make it as private as we can. Teachers are here and the message we are sending out is that we are one team.

Debbie Hedlund: Is date reported positive and negative.

Gamino: I will get the roster to see if anyone is positive or negative.

Whitney Goller: Why don't we test everybody?

Gamino: It is only mandated for the unvaccinated.

Whitney Goller: But as long as we are following the minimum of the mandate why can't we say that everybody gets vaccinated every week. If the point is to not spread the virus vaccinated can still spread the virus that is my concern. Then why not make everybody test.

Gamino: I don't know but I have not asked the staff. In my view some of us may say, wait a minute I'm not mandated, I've already completed all of my testing why do I have to do that? It is difficult either way.

Jan Smith: I agree that because it is still a situation where vaccinated and unvaccinated people can transmit the virus and there are concerns of confidentiality and profiling the past, this would be a great solution. Maybe we say that everybody needs to get this for the protection of our students. This could be a way to deal with all of the problems. If some don't want to do that, we say this is a way our community can solve the problem and be safer for our students.

Gamino: I just want to say that I do not know of a single district in our county that is testing everybody. It does not mean we follow everybody else. There may be staff members that may say, wait a minute nobody else is doing it. If the board wants to give that direction, you give it, I don't know that the staff will be excited for the district to mandate it for all of them to be tested weekly.

Marcela Medina: It should be mandated for all staff since it is proven to safeguard.

Gamino: If that was true, public health would have recommended and mandated the test for all, but they are not. I don't know that staff will be excited knowing that public health has only mandated the unvaccinated to test weekly.

Gamino: I have not spoken to the staff on vaccinated members. I don't believe they will be too excited to covid test each week. If you want to do more you can, I do not recommend that we covid test everyone. I recommend we covid test the unvaccinated and to allow vaccinated staff members to covid test if they want to (optional for them).

Nicole Furstenfeld: Maybe we can look at other rooms for confidential.

Gamino: Testing is mandatory for all unvaccinated. Vaccinated staff may covid test if they want.

Whitney Goller: But we would be following the mandate if all staff covid test.

Gamino: The mandate portion starts next week.

Whitney: In my opinion for November meeting, 28 days is a long time.

Kevin Lebsack: I got to tell you it is very painful if I have to do that without being a mandate, I would take the rest of the year off. I have enough sick days to take the year off. I did it four times in one day and it was painful. I did say to myself that I would never do that again. If the school board tells me I have to do that without being a mandate from the state I would take the rest of the year off. This would be very tough for me to handle.

Gamino: I believe it would be tough for other staff members that are vaccinated to have to do the weekly covid test. We have a hard time finding subs. I strongly recommend that the best thing for our district is to stick with the public health mandate. I respect everyone's opinion, but just like Kevin, I believe some other staff would feel the same way. We just

heard that not everybody wants to take the vaccinate and now you want everyone to take the covid test weekly?

Whitney: I believe there may be kids that may walk out of school.

Gamino: I think so too, I agree, but at least we are following the public health, the other way we are on our own. If we go on our own, we may spend thousands of dollars that we do not have. The children vaccine is coming and everybody has an opinion. The last information I heard they would mandate it for June 2022. We will lose kids if the mandate comes through.

Whitney: At what point do we fight back against these mandates?

Gamino: I don't disagree with anything anybody is saying, all I'm saying that we will lose kids either way. We don't have money to go fight. It seems they have their minds are made up.

Whitney Goller: How much do we get per student? Are we prepared to layoff more staff if we lose some of the kids?

Gamino: Either way this is not an easy decision. We have to follow the mandate. If we don't follow the mandate, we may not have a school. We don't have thousands of dollars to sue the state. No matter what we do, we will lose some kids. I recommend that the board follow the mandate. If the board decides to fight that they can but I do not recommend that the district not follow the mandates. I do not recommend that we go against the mandate. The mandate is considered state law.

Marcela Medina: Our school district cannot afford not to follow the mandates because our school district does anything against the mandates our school would lose everything.

Gamino: By going with the mandates, we may lose some kids but not the whole school. I recommend we follow the mandates whether I believe in the mandates or not. Because that is a state mandate and that would be the law. Maybe we may be able to start an independent study option if the new mandate allows for that for anyone not vaccinated and would like to continue in our district.

Jan Smith: We should have a public forum on this topic to have a process with this as a group of people exclusive for this. See what we can do to have a respectful process. This many parents have a concern and maybe share with the state.

Gamino: We could have a special board meeting and just have a conversation on this topic. I will invite public health folks at our special meeting. I don't know that this would not be divisive no matter what we do.

Whitney Goller: I think that it is a fabulous idea to have a special board meeting. They let us know what they think. Maybe we come together in a constructive way. The mandates

continue to come and they don't stop. Board gathers information and get some facts. District to send a survey to parents, staff, and the community to gather information.

Laura Price: Thank you to everybody for the conversation. Whether we agree or disagree with our neighbors. I'm always supporting we take the safe route. At this point, we either step up and make our voices heard and take the chance of what we can do. These mandates may destroy our communities. A public forum has to be well structured and have the survey out to the community. We need to band together for the sake of our children, schools, and sake of Cuyama. Thank you.

III. Superintendent Report:

A. Michael Wilson Scholarship Fundraiser: Mr. Gamino informed the board and the community of the Michael Wilson Scholarship Fundraiser. It was a great event for our beloved teacher, Mr. Michael Wilson. Many community members participated and I was very impressed with our student participation. Students stayed until everything was cleaned up. Mr. Gamino thanked Mr. Barnes for leading this effort and he also thanked Laura Price for working along with Mr. Barnes in making this event successful. Everything was taken care of from the fliers to the chairs, to the

game events. We had a lot of fun at the event. Mr. Gamino witnessed the free-throw shooting contest and witnessed Luaren Russell making 13 free throws in a row. Mrs. Russell was determined and showed me and everyone else how it is done. We fundraised close to \$3,000.00 for the event. Mr. Gamino thanked Mr. and Mrs. Goller and Conner for cooking the food for the event. Thank you to all for their support. Laura Price did a great job as well.

Speaker Card submitted by Laura Price: I just want to give a shout out to Mr. Barnes He has done a great job of putting this event together. Also, a shout out to all the kids that were working as they were on task throughout.

- IV. Public hearing/forum topic: Proposed Future COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements for Schools. The purpose of this meeting is as follows:
 - A. Review district survey results on the opinion of our Cuyama community regarding vaccination for minors.

 Exemptions:

Mr. Gamino: We sent out a survey to get the opinion of the community to see what they thought about the mandated vaccination for kids. We had a total of 127 responses. 81 parents, 12 community members, 13 classified members, and 21 certificated members take the survey. Of the participants 19 parents had high school students, 53 had elementary school students, and 24 parents had children at both schools. 86 participants do not approve of the vaccine mandate for children. 32 parents approved of the vaccine mandate for children. The survey also revealed that if the mandate is in place, 32% or 33 participants stated they would vaccinate their children and send them to school for in-person learning. 32% or 32 participants would seek an independent study option with the district. 37% would look at some home-schooling option. The 5-11-year-old vaccine will be approved in the next couple of weeks on an emergency approval, is what I am hearing. It is my understanding that the vaccine will be mandated for all 5-11 once fully approved. The vaccine for 7th -12th grade students may be mandated in July of 2022. My goal is to keep you informed throughout the year on the latest information. We don't know yet if vaccines will be required for a student who enrolls in independent study. What about a student who enrolls in independent study but want to play sports? Would that independent study student be required to vaccinate? We will receive further details on these and other matters throughout the year. We don't know the criteria for medical, religious or personal belief exemptions. Mr. Gamino thanked everyone for taking the survey. It seems the issue with the vaccine is that it may be mandated rather than a family/individual option/choice.

B. Santa Barbara Public Health (SBPH) will provide an overview on the latest public health information.

Matt Higgs: Mr. Matt Higgs from SBCPH presented on Covid-19 vaccines and State requirements. Mr. Higgs stated that vaccinations are safe and effective, more that 27 million Californians have received at least one shot. More than 550,000 doses administered in SB County. More than 2 million children aged 12-17 have been vaccinated in California. More than 20,000 children are fully or partially vaccinated in SB County.

Mr. Higgs stated that vaccines have been proven to be a safe and effective way of reducing the spread of the disease since the first vaccine (smallpox) was developed more than 200 years ago.

Covid vaccines have been studied extensively, with data on safety and effectiveness being continually monitored, and more than 220 million Americans have received at least one vaccine dose. Mr. Higgs stated that serious side-effects are extremely rare; most side-effects are signs of a robust immune response (soreness, fatigue, fever, etc.) and subside in about 2 days.

CDPH data shows that unvaccinated individuals are 6.9 times more likely to become infected with COVID. Unvaccinated individuals are 9.9 times more likely to be hospitalized with COVID. Unvaccinated individuals are 15 times more likely to die from COVID.

Pfizer-Biotech Approval Status update: On December 11, 2020, FDA issued emergency use authorization for Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine for individuals 16 and older. May 10, 2021: FDA expands the Pfizer vaccine to include children aged 12-15. August 23, 2021, Pfizer granted full FDA approval for individuals 16 and older.

October 26, 2021: FDA advisory panel recommends approval for Pfizer pediatric vaccine for children 5-11. It is same vaccine formula as previously approved given in a smaller dose to children 5-11. Anticipate CDE advisory committee approval when they meet on November 3rd-4th with State approval to

follow shortly after. Anticipate COVID vaccine for children 5-11 to be available within two weeks. Full FDA approval for children 12-15 and for children 5-11 is yet TBD.

California's vaccine mandate for children: Existing law (Health and Safety Code sections 120325 – 120380) requires California children attending public and private schools to be vaccinated against 10 diseases. They include Diphtheria, Hepatitis B, Haemophilus influenzae type b., Measles, mumps, Pertussis (whooping cough), Rubella, Tetanus, and Varicella (chicken pox). This same law allows CDPH to add new diseases to the list of required vaccinations.

On October 1, 2021, the Governor's office released a statement that COVID-19 will be added to the list of required vaccinations upon receiving full approval from the FDA. 7th -12th (12-15 years old) upon FDA approval for children 12-15 vaccination will be mandatory beginning the next school term (anticipated to be July 1, 2022). K-6th grade (5-11-year-old) upon FDA approval for children 5-11 vaccination will be mandatory beginning the next school term (anticipated date TBD). Further legislation is anticipated.

C. Public Comment on the topic of the Covid 19 Vaccination Requirements for Schools.

Board President allowed everyone that wanted to submit a speaker card to submit one. "We will keep the meeting civil and let everybody have a chance to speak. In no particular order here, they are".

Speaker #1: Lauren Russell re: vaccine mandate and her position to oppose the mandate (6:02 p.m. – 6:09): I think most of you already know how I feel about this. It's a hard NO for our family to get the vaccine. We are just trying to figure out our options at this point. I'm a crier so bear with me. Ok, food for thought? Vaccinated vs unvaccinated, both can spread the virus, both can con contract the virus and both can be hospitalized from the virus and both can die from the virus. But yet, both seem to be at war with each other like one choice outranks the other. I respect everyone's choice and do whatever makes you feel good, but stop judging others for their choices. It is creating too much separation. Be safe out there and keep those community systems right whether vaccinated or not. That is the real cure. I am sad for the world we are raising our kids in, regardless on which side you are on, our children deserve

better than this. One of my questions was "What are the results of the survey mandate? What did we figure?"

Mr. Gamino: 67% of survey respondents have the opinion that they do not like the vaccine mandate. 32% were in favor.

Lauren: Is there a gray area there if we choose independent study vs. home school? Would that open opportunities for sports?

Mr. Gamino: We will be looking to all of that including whether our district independent study students will be exempt from vaccines?

Lauren: They would still be in the system and the district would still receive ADA for them right?

Gamino: Yes, they would be in the system but we still do not know if our independent study students would need to be vaccinated or not?

Lauren: Is independent study something like: here is the packet of work, no teacher, no zoom, nothing?

Gamino: We will be looking into a robust independent study program if necessary for the 2022-2023 school year. We need to get more information.

Whitney: I just want to make sure the facts we are stating are accurate. I went online and went to the "Get vaccinated California website". On their website they say "This mandate will be a condition of in-person attendance, a student who is not vaccinated may remain in independent study but may not attend in-person instruction". This is from the California Get Vaccinated website.

Gamino: Based on that information, the district would be able to create its own independent study program. Then the question is: Can independent students play sports if they are on an independent study program? Remember the independent study students will be with other kids. If so, does that mean the students would have to be vaccinated? We don't know that information yet.

Lauren: You said something that was on point earlier. If this was not mandated and forced upon us, then none of us would be

so outraged. It's our choice, it's our kids, and none of this is even studied. It should be terrifying that that guy (Matt Higgs) said it has taken one year to come up with this vaccine. It is very strenuous details as far as vaccines go. No, this just came out of nowhere and everyone is supposed to take it. No, I mean when doctors and nurses are quitting their jobs over this mandate, I think it is time to let everyone know that there is something seriously wrong. So many people are moving out of the state to get away from this mandate. This is the fastest vaccine to ever be developed. The mumps vaccine in 1967 took for years. Vaccine development is difficult and strenuous process that take an average of 10-15 years to accomplish. If you are not angry about this, you are not paying any attention or you are being fed the media's crap that either you believe or you don't. I just feel like to push this on the kids is totally wrong. If you want to get it, do what you think is right, and do not force them to get this to go to school. It is only a matter of time before I feel that I have to pull them out. You know and I talk to you every day. It is like we lived in this valley our whole life and there are familiar teachers that are still teaching here that taught my husband and we don't want to have to move out of state because that is not even an option for us but this state is pushing more and more people away and that is scary. My other question is "What are the consequences for the school if you don't comply because there are 15 plus schools that are coming out and not complying with the mandate. What are you losing money?

Gamino: We will be looking into exactly what the consequences are for schools who do not comply with the mandate.

Lauren: If it is insurance, your ADA will be going down as there are a number of people that will not be putting up with this. We are our own district, right?

Gamino: Yes, we are.

Lauren: Do we have any extra strings we can pull or does the state run these schools?

Gamino: We are looking into all the things that we can and cannot do.

Lauren: If we are our own district as a board and community can't we decide what we want to do?

Gamino: Some things are not our options.

Heather Lomax: Medical and religious exemptions are a gray area.

Jan Smith: He also said personal beliefs so it sounded like we don't know how that is defined.

Heather Lomax: We can take notes and I know everyone has a ton of questions.

Selina Martinez: Opposes the vaccine mandate: My concern is that we are looking at mandating the vaccine. I believe it should be what we would like to do for our kids. I don't think we should be bullied. Another thing is that this community is so small I feel we can kind of control it instead of trying to follow what everyone else is doing. Another thing is "He did say that if vaccine is mandated, we could do religious and medical reasons but once it becomes approved with all of the vaccinations that are required for schools then there are no exemptions for other than medical". That is all I have to say. Once it becomes part of the school record then you can only apply for a medical reason.

Sonya Herrera: First, I want to say thank you very much for sending out the survey and have our voices heard. That is huge and I am sincerely hopeful that there is a way we can take this back to whoever needs to hear about how we feel about this. Our kids have already been put through you know what, for the last two years. This vaccine has not been out long enough. I have two patients right now who are fully vaccinated who have Covid. If I want to go to Santa Barbara meeting, I will have to wear a mask whether I have been vaccinated or not. Where does this stop? If you want to get a vaccine, do it. There is a thing called natural immunity. We all have it, some more than others. Those that do not have it so much should consider getting the vaccine. Vaccine should be an independent, individual choice. I hate seeing this cruelty. Wearing masks during basketball games? It's a virus and is not going out anytime soon. Aids still around, hepatitis B still around, the flu, the cold, we have to learn to live with it. How come our parents don't have an exemption? That's all.

Andrew Wagner: We are home schoolers so I believe in doing our own research and looking at things. I see the Governor passed the mandate and his children are not vaccinated, that is point #1. #2: They wrote a list of all of the things our kids need to have in order to go to school. Of all of those things, they have been around for 50 years. The Covid vaccine has killed more people and have more side effects in one year than all those things he listed have done in 50 years of vaccines. I don't think safe and effective is what we have to say. Israel has the highest vaccination rate in the world and they have 8 times more probability of being hospitalized with Covid then the unvaccinated. When Moderna and Pfizer did their study on children, one in 1,000 died. You are going to give students a shot that is 175 times more likely to die from a shot itself, not from the disease, then that is a problem. If your mask is so dangerous from Covid, why do we put it in a normal trash receptable? It is not what everyone says. The CDE says that at least 40% of children have had Covid and natural immunity so why give these children the vaccine?

Vaccinated people carry 250 times the load of virus than an unvaccinated person. The vaccinated person can spread it more than a person who is unvaccinated.

Laura Price: I apologize because you know that I will cry. I have as many of you have felt the most anxiety than I ever felt before. As a mother whose first child was born 2 months early and only 3 pounds is saying something. I faced decisions to keep my babies safe on a daily basis like all parents do. I will say I have vaccinated my children with the normal vaccines. When those vaccines were created, our children now were not Ginny pigs for that developed vaccines back then. My fears are my children's health, both mentally and physically.

During the 2020-2021 school year my kids struggled. They thrive in a classroom setting with their teachers and their peers. Arts, crafts and PE I'm fine with teaching that, but now I'm facing the possibility of being a full-time teacher on top of full time employee and everything else. But it is not just my kids that I am worried about, as many of you know, I worry about all families that feel forced into a vaccine as full-time home schooling is not an option. I fear that the mandate will ultimately close our schools and hurt our communities in so many levels. We have had so few cases and the school and community have kept Covid cases low unlike many of our neighboring districts. Cuyama has a unique lifestyle. We don't have access to private schools and charters are filling up. It is my hope that the school district is willing to push back against these mandates for the sake of our kids, schools, and our community.

Elaine Brown: Opposes vaccine mandates: We are 110% against this and we don't think this is right. This vaccine has not

been tested. I've worked in pediatrics for 8 years. I'm not antivax. It takes extensive studies to create a vaccine. Education California code 49005.8 restraint techniques. Any school official aiding is subject to issues. The district has to stop enforcing mask mandates. The funds that are allocated can be used for anything. On the vaccinated vs unvaccinated issue: It's never going to end now they want us to get a booster. Natural immunity is longer lasting and we should not be forced to take an experimental treatment. We should not subject our children to the vaccine. I strongly urge everyone to turn off your tv and talk to your neighbor and know, tv is just one sided.

Kathleen Ricci: I was hired by Mr. Gamino to help the children that have been out of the classroom and to help them get caught up. I am really concerned as an educator that if we decided that we don't want our children in the classroom and want to go back to home schooling. What I have experienced is that our children could be a year to 1.5 years behind where they should be. We will be jeopardizing our kids if we don't figure out some sort of middle of the road to be able to keep them in school to be able to comply somehow with the state requirements. I understand your concern about having the vaccine. I had polio, chicken pox and I caught chicken pox four times. I understand the concern but I think, that as a community, we should come to some sort of solution. If worse comes to worse, we take two buses to Sacramento.

No speakers on Zoom: - None

This concludes our public forum. Thank you for our input. Board Members:

Whitney Goller: Since this is a public hearing, I would like to voice my opinion. I am here as a board member today. I would rather be here as a parent. I'm not anti-vaxxer. This has been one of the most stressful terms to be a board member. Between our money issues and now our Covid issues. I will start off by going to the survey. There were 127 responses. I realize not all the parents were able to get on and voice their opinions. We had 37 families of our students represented and completed the survey. 96 parents completed the survey. Assuming each parent had one student and that is being conservative. That equates to \$384,000 in lost revenue, or 20% of our revenue as a whole. 40% of the 96 parents say that they will not vaccinate their child and seek an independent study option with the district. Excuse me, the 40% would remove the student from the school district. Not

seek independent study. That is approximately 38.4 children just of those that completed the survey. That equates to approximately 6 teachers on the lower end of the pay scale. I can't imagine having a district with 6 less teachers. I realize we don't want to get sued by the state but frankly, I don't want to be bullied about being sued by the state. I think we have an opportunity to stand up and to voice our opinion and give the facts to the state. Here are the six teachers you are putting out of work. Here are 38.4 children who are going to home school and lose their ability to communicate with their peers. A San Bernardino County(Apple Valley Unified School District) just passed a resolution to basically tell the state "Screw you". I agree with Mrs. Ricci that we should load up our buses, while we still have them, and go to the Sacramento and tell them what they are doing to this district, while the district is still here because frankly, if we lose 20% of our revenue, I don't know what we will do. We just got notified by CSBA that for the 2022-2023 school year, due to lower enrollment, the schools are not going to get near as much money as they were. Regarding the exemptions: Richard Pam, who was a state senator of the 2015 law eliminating the personal belief law. Now, he has started the steps for legislation to remove the exemptions because he doesn't think the exemptions should apply. Another issue, the lack of consistent information. According to CDE it is 2.4 higher No consistent information from infectious rate. professionals. Let me read something from the Get Vaccinated website: California continues to lead the nation in lowest Covid rates, lowest death rates, and the most vaccinations administered. Less than ½ the hospitalizations than the nation as a whole. If this is true, then why do we need the vaccines? If you are vaccinated, why would you worry whether my kid is vaccinated? California educates 12% of students and accounts for 1/2 % of school closures. I know we will lose more staff that we are not equipped to lose. From the Board, not the Superintendent, but from the Board, we need to express our opinion and tell the state what they are doing to the school district and we all sign it and deliver it to them because they will put our school out of business. All these families will leave the valley. All because the state is putting politics in schools. We are here to educate not here to be biased and my kids will not be getting the vaccine.

Emily Johnson: I agree with Whitney about the financial consequences of the mandate and I look forward to understanding our options. There is so much unknown at this time. I would like to ensure that we proactively seek some

compensation and seek and see if we can be exempt from these state laws.

Jan Smith: I really appreciate this community. I feel that our meeting has been so respectful today. I feel we have a lot of different views about this but what seems really clear is that our community has been really safe the last couple of years. What makes sense is that we honor what the people here need and we want to keep our school available for children and find ways to come together to be able to continue with everyone's needs being met and respected. I'm impressed how we have navigated this so far. I feel a lot of concern for having to make decisions to make decisions what goes against beliefs of what is best for our children. We want to find a way for those that don't want to be vaccinated attend school.

Heather Lomax: We do keep our schools functioning and open. We can keep our schools open to our students and make it effective for everyone.

Gamino: I want to thank everyone for being here tonight. We are going to look at pros and cons and have all the information. It would be great if we could do it without the mandate, but it does not look like this may be an option on this point. What are our options? We do have time as this point as the mandate may start July 2022. We will keep everyone updated. Our staff is working together and we will continue to do that. If there are no exemptions, we may lose some staff as well. I don't want to tell you that there will or there will not be exemptions. We will continue to have conversations.

Cuyama Joint Unified School District Resolution #2021:006

The Board of Trustees of the Cuyama Joint Unified School District hereby acknowledges that:

WHEREAS, the guidance provided by the State and local government agencies and health officer has been changing over time; and

WHEREAS, On October 1, 2021, Governor Newsom issued a press release and additional information indicating that he is directing CDPH to require a COVID-19 vaccination for all K-12 grade students following full approval by the Federal Food & Drug Administration (FDA) of a COVID-19 vaccine for students in the following grade spans: K-6 and 7-12. The additional information published along with the press release indicates the vaccine requirement will also apply to K-12 school employees serving students in those grade spans; and

WHEREAS, based on a community survey and parental input at the October 28, 2021, board meeting, the Cuyama Valley Community is of the opinion that vaccines should be available to any student whose parents approve and give permission to have their children vaccinated but are of the opinion that the vaccine for minors and for staff should not be mandated; and

WHEREAS, current law provides that 10 currently mandated vaccines are required prior to a student's first admission to a given school, subject only to a narrow medical exemption; and that additional vaccines (including COVID-19 vaccines) may be required but would be subject to broader medical and personal belief exemptions; and

WHEREAS, a joint statement issued by California Health and Human Services Agency Secretary Dr. Mark Ghaly, and California Department of Public Health Director and State Public Health Officer Dr. Tomas Aragon, on October 20, 2021, which reaffirmed the state's approach to preventing COVID-19 in schools and protecting our students' health – continuing the state's masking requirements in K-12 settings. The guidance also requires schools to develop and implement local protocols to enforce the mask requirements, but schools "do not have discretion or authority to opt out from enforcing the requirements."

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Cuyama Joint Unified School District Board of Education requests the State of California to work expeditiously to provide consistent and timely guidance for schools that appropriately allows mask wearing to be optional when conditions warrant, and to clarify what those benchmarks would be; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Cuyama Joint Unified School District Board of Trustees requests the State of California to restore local authority to create and implement COVID-19 safety plans, including guidelines for masks, quarantines, vaccinations, and the establishment of normal classroom instruction tailored to local conditions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Cuyama Joint Unified School District Board of Trustees believes that staff and parental choice in vaccination and other health decisions is important; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Cuyama Joint Unified School District will not implement a vaccine requirement unless and until one is imposed by State or local health officers; and, finally

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Superintendent of the Cuyama Joint Unified School District is directed, by the Board of Trustees, to transmit this Resolution to Governor Gavin Newsom, State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond, Director and State Public Health Officer CDPH, Dr. Tomas J. Aragon; Dr. Mark Ghaly, California Health and Human Services; Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors; and Santa Barbara County Superintendent of Schools, Dr. Susan Salcido; to make known the desires expressed by the Cuyama Joint Unified School District Board of Trustees regarding public health decisions related to COVID-19.

The Board of Trustees in compliance with Government Code Section 3547, makes the following initial proposal (Sunshine Proposal) for the 2021-2022 school year to the California School Employees Association and its Cuyama Chapter #288 to reopen salary and benefits plus two unspecified articles in this agreement for the 2021-2022.

District's Initial Proposal:

- 1. Article VI: Hours and Overtime
- 2. **Article VII:** Compensation and Health benefits: The district proposes to negotiate a wage and benefit package offering fair compensation consistent with the district's current economic condition and the economic conditions affecting public education in the State of California.
- 3. The district reserves the right to reopen another unspecified article at a later time.

The district may offer new article, new proposals, counterproposals, withdrawal of proposals and/or other changes to proposals that are responsive to discussions that occur during negotiations, or that the district deems necessary in response to changes in education funding or other education requirements.

The district may propose non-substantive language changes in various articles in order to eliminate typographical errors or to clarify the intent of information contained herein.

The Board and administration look forward to an early and amicable settlement of negotiations.

Once the "sunshine" process is complete, the superintendent will communicate the district's availability for bargaining.

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K-12 Counselor: Academic, social, emotional

DEFINITION:

Under the immediate supervision of the site principal, the Counselor provides academic counseling, social emotional counseling, and behavioral management support and counseling to students and supports principal and/or designee, school staff, and parents as they work with students. In addition, the counselor assists with supervision of students, with district compliance reports, graduation ceremonies, and other duties as assigned by principal/designee.

- 7. Provides relevant high-quality professional development and consultation to classroom staff, administrators, other professionals, and parents. E
- 8. Communicates effectively with staff, administrators, outside agencies, and parents to coordinate activities, exchange information, and resolve issues. E
- 9. Coordinates and assists with student testing including SAT, PSAT, CAASPP, Healthy Kids Survey, and other required testing. E
- 10. Accurately prepares, completes, and maintains and analyzes a variety of comprehensive reports, records, and files related to assigned activities and personnel. Such reports and processes include LCAP, Office of Civil Rights, Williams Reports, etc.E
- 11. Share and demonstrate knowledge of behavioral analysis, positive discipline techniques, and effective practices with parents and school personnel. **E**
- 12. Interpret, apply, and explain applicable laws, codes, regulations, policies, and procedures related to assigned activities. E
- 13. Attend and conduct a variety of meetings related to assignment. E
- 14. Maintains regular and prompt attendance in the workplace. E
- 15. Counsels with pupils, parents, and teachers relative to student academic and behavioral progress and/or provides recommendations regarding their successful transition to and from high school. E
- 16. Counsel's pupils, in a group or individual basis, who are experiencing academic learning and social emotional issues and/or behavioral difficulties, involving parents when appropriate. E
- 17. Works with other district staff in developing and implementing dropout and intervention programs. **E**

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- 18. Assist students in timely completion of college application forms and financial aid and scholarship applications. E

HEALTH OFFICIALS AB 361 SOCIAL DISTANCE RECOMMENDATION

Issued: September 28, 2021

COVID-19 disease prevention measures, endorsed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, include vaccinations, facial coverings, increased indoor ventilation, handwashing, and physical distancing (particularly indoors).

Since March 2020, local legislative bodies-such as commissions, committees, boards, and councils- have successfully held public meetings with teleconferencing as authorized by Executive Orders issued by the Governor. Using technology to allow for virtual participation in public meetings is a social distancing measure that may help control transmission of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. Public meetings bring together many individuals (both vaccinated and potentially unvaccinated), from multiple households, in a single indoor space for an extended time. For those at increased risk for infection, or subject to an isolation or quarantine order, teleconferencing allows for full participation in public meetings, while protecting themselves and others from the COVID-19 virus.

Utilizing teleconferencing options for public meetings is an effective and recommended social distancing measure to facilitate participation in public affairs and encourage participants to protect themselves and others from the COVID-19 disease. This recommendation is further intended to satisfy the requirement of the Brown Act (specifically Gov't Code Section 54953(e)(1)(A)), which allows local legislative bodies in the County of Santa Barbara to use certain available teleconferencing options set forth in the Brown Act.
